
"Watch for the Canaries"

Long ago, before coal or gold miners had high-tech equipment to measure carbon dioxide levels in the air, dangerous gases would accumulate in the mines and lead to devastating explosions. So miners learned to use a low-tech solution: they carried canaries as a barometer of the air quality in the mines. When the canaries stopped singing, the gas levels were too high and the miners quickly left the mine to avoid being caught in an explosion.



What are your decision-making canaries — those small indications that something may not be right in your atmosphere? That is the question that we ask the missionaries that come to us for debriefing and the message I shared the first morning at our **YWAM Caribbean leaders gathering in Orlando** — 65 ministry leaders came for five days. The main purpose of this gathering was to seek God for a new structure to give leadership help and pastoral care for the region, which had now grown to 28 campuses and over 350 full time staff across four main language groups. We are so thankful to God who gave much wisdom and unity.

The next week our team hosted a **4-day missionary wellness retreat** in the same city. During the retreat we spent time learning about 6 areas of wellness. One of the highlights was having Coach Tim Powers share on physical and nutritional health. Coach has written the book "Fit to Serve" and was an Olympic coach as well as a trainer for Navy Seals. He was such an inspiration, teaching practical ways to stay physically healthy. It has now been three months since that gathering and one of persons who attended said:

Team to Washington DC

I remember growing up with a saying "God is not a respecter of persons." It sounded good and was supposed to challenge us in our view of who God loves. In June, while leading a team to Washington DC, God really challenged that phrase. We had such diverse ministry experiences during that week. One day we visited and fed the homeless in the park and the next day we were sitting with US Senate Chaplain Barry Black and praying in the US Capital building. The next morning we cut the grass in a cemetery where over 3000 slaves had been buried, and then at night had a personal time with the former President of Malawi. During that week God changed that phrase for me to **"God is a respecter of persons not positions."** His love encompasses the homeless as well as the presidents.

So much is happening with our focus on missionary family care.
